Learning and Teaching Methods

The objectives - to equip students with the knowledge and skills that will enable them to solve fundamental problems in the field of Land, Commercial and Civil Registries, while fostering attitudes of analysis and critical reflection - are in total coherence with the programmatic content that focuses on the organization and operation of the Land, Commercial and Civil Registries.

Assessment Methods

1. During the period of continuous and periodic assessment, the assessment is carried out through two written tests, both carried out in person.

Each test will have a weight of 50% in the final grade.

The test dates will be published by the Course Director on the E-learning/Moodle platform;

A minimum score of 8.00 (eight) is required in each of the tests (whole number, no rounding);

Access to the 2nd test depends on obtaining the aforementioned minimum score;

The final classification is calculated by weighting the grades obtained in each of the tests, according to their respective weights;

The student is approved if they obtain, in the sum of the marks obtained in each of the tests (according to the respective weights), a classification equal to or greater than 10.00 (ten) values.

2. At the time of appeal, the assessment will be carried out by written exam.

The exam will have a weight of 100% in the final classification and the student will be approved if he obtains a classification equal to or greater than 10.00 (ten) points.
