Learning and Teaching Methods

Participants will present their collection of OER materials. They will introduce their learning design for students' learning process by which they will facilitate their students to create their own learning materials, find relevant OER and find and establish a connection to personal learning networks.

Assessment Methods

Student assessment will be continuous and operationalized through the following assessment elements:

- Attendance and participation: 20%.

- Quality and relevance of the developed materials: 70%. - Presentation: 10%.

In the assessment by EXAM (all sessions), there will be a single final exam carrying 100% of the weight.
